

ICF ACC Acquisition Guide for Level 1 Graduates



This guide summarizes the key steps and prerequisites for obtaining the ICF Associate Certified Coach (ACC) accreditation through the Level 1 pathway, according to the official ICF guide.

1. Prerequisites

- Completion of a Level 1 training program (60+ hours of coach-specific training).
- A total of 100+ hours of coaching experience, with at least 75 hours paid and 25 hours within the last 18 months.
- Experience with at least 8 different clients.
- 10 hours of mentor coaching from an ACC (current), PCC or MCC coach, including at least 3 hours individually, spread over at least 3 months.
- Completion of a Performance Evaluation within the Level 1 program.

2. Application Process

- Log in to your account on the ICF site and select the Level 1 route.
- Fill in the online application form and attach all the required information (certificate of completion, coaching hours, mentor coaching).

- Possible audit to confirm the data and contact your clients for verification.
- Application fee: \$175 USD (ICF member) or \$325 USD (non-member).

3. ACC exam.

- After the application is approved, you will receive an email to schedule the exam via Pearson VUE (on-site or online).
- The exam is 90 minutes long and consists of 60 questions in two parts of 30.

- The successful score is 460 on a scale of 200-600.
- After completion, you receive the results and credential if you pass.

4. Summary Steps

- Completion of Level 1 training (60+ hours, mentor coaching, performance evaluation).
- Collect evidence of coaching hours and mentor coaching.
- Submit application to ICF and payment of fees.
- Completion of the ACC examination.
- Receive ACC accreditation.
